Several transmitters were set up; we made contacts, and had a nice potluck dinner in the evening. We did Field Day for the fun of it, but in case you might be interested, here are some stats about the event.

FD overall

Total Entries	4,929	
Total Participants	29,679	
Total QSO's	1,274,517	
Total 5A entrants	73	(This was our station class)
Total MO entrants	110	

WAØSDO was the highest scoring 5A station in Missouri.

SPARK contacts	32
SPARK participants	35
SPARK score	1,520

Some of the COVID rules in previous years continued to be applied. Other operators could make contacts using their home stations and contribute their scores to a club. SPARK only had one such contribution.





SEDALIA 2022 CHRISTMAS PARADE!
