Amazon Smile was mentioned at the October SPARK meeting and there was some confusion about just what it was. Well, Amazon runs a cool program where they give back a little bit of your purchases to a charity or cause of your choice. There is no reason to go into detail here because you can easily point your web browser to **smile.amazon.com** and read up on it yourself.

When you go to the link mentioned above, you will sign in with your Amazon ID. Then select the favorite cause to which you want to contribute. In this case, you could search for **SPARK**, but you will be presented with a very large list. It will be best to search for 'Sedalia Pettis' Amateur Radio Klub'. Or, a shorter 'Sedalia Pettis' which will get you a short list where you can easily scroll down and locate our club.

Once you select the charity and get it enabled, your future Amazon purchases will result in a small portion being diverted to the club as a contribution. The price you pay at Amazon doesn't change. Sure, it isn't much, but it is something.

ONCE AGAIN WE HONOR ONE OF OUR OWN! MARK (KØNYE)




