### TECH TALK

# An enlightening article showcasing the radio career of Daren Nerad (KDØOPS)

My first interest in Ham radio was in high school and through some friends whose relatives were operators in Nashville TN. Up to that point I experimented with CB. DX was my only experience with radio. Through the years I had learned my father was a radio operator while in the USMC. I thought that sounded like fun......so I enlisted. That opened up the world of radio to me. I took on the same MOS (Military Occupational Specialty) as my father had (2531 - Field radio operator). I was schooled on everything from UHF to HF and several forms and types of communications in-between. The radio and operation skills I still draw from are based on my education in the military. After I returned to civilian life it took me a couple of years before I reached back out to explore the path of Ham Radio. Reaching out to S.P.A.R.K. lead me to Doug McIndoo (N4RZB) who helped me get connected with a Ham 101 class that WAARIC put on. After getting my ticket in May of 2011 (KDØOPS), I then upgraded to General in March of 2018 while my wife Amber (KEØQYL) gained her Tech License that same session. More recently I achieved my goal of Extra Class in May of 2021 and proceeded to upgrade my VE status to reflect my Extra Class. I now am focusing on enjoying the hobby and trying to offer Ham Radio classes and help others wanting to get their ticket or upgrade. ELMERing and Mentoring is one of the most valuable resources to new hams and feel the more we make ourselves available the more likely we can continue to sustain the hobby. ### **SIGNING OFF WITH BROOKS (KAØJWA)**



In this day and age, the amateur bands are always under attack. Be it from business concerns looking for more spectrum space, shortwave broadcasters on the HF bands or even bootleggers operating within our own allocated frequencies. There are more Hams right now than at any point in history, but many times while scanning the low bands there are very few stations heard. I know some repeaters in more populated areas are fairly active, but they are the exception to the rule. Most repeaters nationwide wide remain quiet with little or no use. The point is if we don't use our privileges, we will lose them. Turn on your radio and make a contact. This doesn't mean you have to be on the air 24 hours

a day, just make an extra call now and then to foster new activity. No one knows you're there if you don't make some noise. If you know of someone with interest in Ham Radio, encourage them to the best of you ability. Send him or her our way and we'll be happy to help them work towards their license.
