


#### Saturday, June 10<sup>th</sup>

My introduction into radio began at the United States Army Southeastern Signal School; Fort Gordon, GA. My MOS was 31L20, Radio Relay and Carrier Repairman, Multi-channel communication equipping. I was a very happy teenager, sent to 172nd Infantry Brigade at Ft Richardson, Alaska, 1966 - 69.



I was licensed as an Amateur Radio operator at Tyler, Texas on March 2, 1993, with the call sign KB5YXD. Thirty days later I passed the 5 wpm code test and became a Tech Plus. The Heathkit I had would only work on CW. The following year, April 12th of 1994, I upgraded to General with the required 13 wpm code test; August 9th upgraded to Advanced Class and requested a 2 x 2 callsign; I received KJ5ZW.

After 23 years as an Advanced Class operator, while working in Missouri, I upgraded to Extra Class on May 2017.

Started the VE team with S.P.A.R.K. (Sedalia Pettis Amateur Radio Klub) in Sedalia, MO and enjoyed membership and activities with my "Home town club" of Sedalia, until we moved back to Texas in 2019, to be closer to family.

My other hobbies are: woodcarving, fly tying and gardening. I'm an active Accredited Volunteer Examiner (VE) as well. This year (2023), have started a newsletter, with the Wood County Amateur Radio Association, meeting monthly at Quitman, and weekly on the Radio net.

My radios are Kenwood TS-440S I use for CW, SSB and shortwave listening. My "retirement" radio is Yaesu FT-857D. The Yaesu allows me to be active on 2 meter nets, as well as HF. CW, SSB, & Digital.

MFJ-949E is the transmatch used for both HF rigs.

I work 80, 40, 30, and 20 meters. As a Morse Code operator, I am a member of: SKCC 13031 and FISTS 12378. I am a Charter Member of Upshur Area Amateur Radio Club.

# Licensee Hit With \$24,000 Fine for Jamming Net, Failure to ID: FCC

An investigation by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) results in a large fine against a California amateur radio license holder. A <u>Notice of Apparent Liability Forfeiture (NALF) for \$24,000</u> has been filed against Phillip J. Beaudet, N6PJB, of Burney, California. According to the filing, the penalty is for Beaudet "willfully and repeatedly interfering with the radio communications of the Western Amateur Radio Friendship Association (WARFA) while it was attempting to hold a regularly scheduled net and for failing to provide station identification on amateur radio frequencies." FCC agents used direction finding techniques during November and December of 2022 to track the interfering signals to Beaudet's home station. Agents "heard him playing recordings on 3.908 MHz that caused interference to the ongoing WARFA net while failing to provide his assigned amateur call sign," the document stated.
