## Jeff Kesterson (WBØLRX)– 220 Report to March 2<sup>nd</sup> Meeting Attendees

- We had an internet outage causing Echolink to be down, which meant that the link to the Republic MO repeater for our Wednesday night net failed.
- I had to check our equipment physically at the tower first, after doing that and seeing that it was an internet issue, they were contacted and it's been resolved Echolink is now working.
- We expect that for this coming Wednesday's net we'll again be linked to the Republic MO repeater
- The Echolink still seems to allow only one connection at a time, and this is proving harder to solve than it should be. I'm looking for a solution, but in the meantime, <u>I request that we avoid</u> <u>connecting to the 220 repeater by Echolink from about 7:30pm until 10pmn Wednesday nights</u>. The reason is, if someone is already connected when the link to Republic attempts to connect, it will fail, and it does not automatically retry.
- But if someone forgets, and connects via Echolink on Wed nights it will not be a big deal! But please try to avoid it, if it happens it happens.
- For those who might be interested, the 220 repeater is a Bridgecom BCR-220 repeater with an SCom 7330 controller and Raspberry Pi for IRLP and Echolink. It puts about 30 watts output power, and our antenna is a Comprod dual dipole antenna on top of the tower 240' above ground level.
- Future plans (but I'm slow at getting to things)
  - I'm still thinking about the remote receiver in Sedalia but have been busy on other projects.
    Also, at some point I want to move everything into a new rack which I have and really clean up the 220 repeater installation. This sounds simple, but it will actually take a number of trips to the tower; there's also an old rack cabinet that will need to be hauled away somewhere, maybe someone will want it?

#### Amateur Radio Stands Ready to Support Eclipse Operations

The upcoming April 8, 2024, solar eclipse has many excited about the opportunity to witness the darkness of totality. Spectators from across the country are traveling to the path of total darkness that will stretch from South Texas to Northeastern Maine.

Some states are anticipating more than a million travelers for the event. In the impacted areas, schools will be letting students out early for the day, and residents are being encouraged to avoid driving on the day of the event. Emergency response organizations are adding staff for the event in many areas. The eclipse is expected to directly impact parts of 14 states as it moves across the country. The travel impact alone could be substantial.

In preparation for the event, many state emergency management organizations have called on local hams to provide communication services via HF nets and locally on VHF/UHF frequencies. There have been numerous planning meetings, exercises, and preparations across the country. The <u>ARRL Emergency</u> <u>Management department</u> has worked with ARRL Section Emergency Coordinators and Section Managers in the directly affected areas to collect the frequencies each Section plans to utilize, and to assist in any frequency conflicts. Hams across multiple states and ARRL Sections have been practicing their communications capabilities via Winlink, SSB, and CW. "It is great to see Sections along the path working together to be prepared to assist in any emergency, should it occur during the event," said ARRL Director of Emergency Management Josh Johnston, KE5MHV. "Heavy traffic is the major concern, but [anything can happen] during such a large event," he added.

Johnston went on to say, "There will be several on-air operating events on the day of the eclipse, but please give some space for any emergency traffic that may be taking place as well."

Ham Radio Science Citizen Investigation (HamSCI) is leading the <u>Solar Eclipse QSO Party</u> which will allow radio amateurs to participate in propagation research by operating during the eclipse and submitting their logs. Much of that activity will be focused on the FT8 frequencies of the non-World Administrative Radio Conference (WARC) HF bands, but all modes will be welcome during the event.

## MAJOR Ham Radio Legislation! Emergency Preparedness Act of 2024

This is James KN4NEH, the CEO of Ham Radio Prep today with a huge announcement about major legislation that affects the entire ham radio community.

Two U.S. Senators, **Roger Wicker from Mississippi** and **Richard Blumenthol from Connecticut**, have introduced legislation to give ham radio operators the right to install outdoor antennas on residential properties and serve their community.

Many homeowners associations prevent ham radio operators from <u>installing antennas</u>, which leaves many American communities without any type of backup communication system in the event of a blackout, natural disaster, or other communication outage.

So I want to commend Senator's Wicker and Blumenthol for taking this extremely important step for American security and communications, and I want to extend our full support of Ham Radio Prep for this legislation.

One of the <u>major reasons for the amateur radio service</u> in the United States is to ensure that all Americans communicate when cell phone service and internet are not available.

This is critical infrastructure for US communications, and amateur radio operators are the backbone of our off-grid communications infrastructure.

This act is called the **Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act of 2024**. We'll post links so you can read more about this.

Let's come together as an amateur radio community to get behind this piece of legislation and help build our communications infrastructure, so that our communities can stay connected in every disaster situation.
