

### Stanley Clawson Potts Jr June 5, 1939 — March 18, 2025



Stanley Clawson Potts Jr, 85, of Sedalia, MO, passed away on Tuesday, March 18, 2025, at his home. He was born on Jne 5, 1939, in Tipton, MO, the son of Stanley C. Potts Sr. and Mary (Thorpe) Potts, who preceded him in death.

Stanley was a proud graduate of Tipton High School, Class of 1957. He dedicated many years to his work as a Union Carpenter for the Carpenters Union of Central Illinois. A committed member of his

community, he was actively involved in the Green Ridge, MO, American Legion, the Sons of the American Legion, and was a devoted member of Discover Church.

Stanley found great joy in volunteering at the Heckart Community Center, where he spent years calling Bingo for seniors. He was also a member of the Ham Operators Club of Sedalia (KFOPXN) and an avid CB radio enthusiast, known by his handle, "Stanley Steamer."

A passionate collector, Stanley amassed over 100 Nativity scenes and had a deep love for model trains. His dedication to Discover Church was evident in the countless hours he spent maintaining its facilities, decorating for the holidays, and cherishing the fellowship of its members. He also had a keen eye for bargains, rarely missing a chance to hunt for treasures at local garage sales.

Stanley is survived by three sons, Bill Wyatte (Robin) of Sedalia, Tim Potts (Amy) of Sedalia, and Michael Potts (Christine) of Dayton, TX; a brother, Jimmy Potts of Louisiana; and two sisters, Pat Kiesling of California, MO, and Tina Potts of Tipton, MO; thirteen grandchildren; 34 great-grandchildren; and numerous nieces, nephews, and cousins.

In addition to his parents, Stanley was preceded in death by a daughter, Patty Gardner.

Funeral services were held at 11:00 a.m. Wednesday, March 26, 2025, at Discover Church, Sedalia, with Pastor Ed Spencer officiating.

The family received friends one hour prior to the service at the church.

The burial was at Crown Hill Cemetery, Sedalia, MO.

#### THE FOX HUNT! WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT?



**The Concept:** A "fox" (a person or a device) hides a low-powered transmitter in a designated area, and other ham radio operators, the "hunters," use their RDF skills to find it.

**The Goal:** The hunters use directional antennas to pinpoint the direction of the signal emitted by the hidden transmitter and then follow that signal to locate the fox.

**Equipment:** Hunters typically use <u>yagi antennas</u> or loop <u>antennas</u>, which are designed to receive signals more strongly

from a specific direction, along with a radio receiver and a compass.

- Variations: Fox hunts can take various forms, from simple hunts within a small area to more complex competitions involving multiple transmitters and longer distances.
- **Skills:** Fox hunting develops essential RDF skills that can be valuable in other amateur radio activities, such as locating a repeater jammer or assisting in search and rescue operations.

We were pleased to have Tony Brumfield (KJ4UVS) share an interesting and insightful presentation at our March meeting! Following is a synopsis of information and photos of Fox Hunt transmitter and antenna that he has constructed.

"My presentation was primarily to show the Club a deployable transmitter (FOX). I have since rebuilt the unit from an old metal surplus ammo can. The plastic one I had on Saturday lacked a ground plane for the antenna which introduced erratic behavior. The transmitter is an inexpensive Baofeng UV-5R, a couple of SMA adapters and an Arduino Uno to control it. I am still learning how to write the code in the Arduino IDE software to improve functionality. The Arduino sketch and the inspiration that I am currently using originated from a member of the Whitecourt Amateur Radio Club.

The other items that were passed around (see photos following) included a tape measure yagi that I plan to add an attenuator to, and a Quansheng UVK5 with egzumer V0.22 firmware. The custom firmware adds an S-meter and an RSSI level to the device to help with locating the strongest signal direction.

As I learn more I plan to share the knowledge with the club. I am looking forward to our first FOX hunt. Please let me know if you have any questions, or would like any additional information."
