



My Newest Radio, At Least, "New" To Me! By Phillip Markmann

Heathkit HW - 16 with VFO HG – 10B In the picture below you see I used my MFJ – 949E and Headphones.

The straight key is the one I started out with in 1993 when I had my Tech Plus Amateur operator's license.

This rig works great and has LOTS OF nostalgia! This rig reminds me of the short poem that reads like this:

"Forget the net.
Switch on the set.
Warm it up slow and go.
Light the tubes, bask in the glow.
Surf shortwaves on your old radio."



In another article I talked about my Hallicrafter receiver. It cast the glow that is in the poem above.

This is a loaner rig and it has a smooth tone. Billy let me play with it, with the idea that this would be used at field day 2025.

This year, for some reason unknown to me, I am looking forward to Field Day more than I usually do. I always enjoy FD with the folks of the Wood County Amateur Radio Association. We will be operation as WC5TX and will be at Collins Field, an airport approximately halfway between Mineola and Quitman. At the present time, it appears to me we "may have" two radios instead of one this year. Perhaps even a third radio just for CW and Digital operations as well (?); we will see. The 3rd Saturday of this month is our monthly meeting and the decision will be made at that time.

As for the Heathkit radio pictured above, it could be used or I may bring a radio I am more familiar with. It is fun playing with the Heathkit, however, I do not want to take up valuable time when a digital program operator could be making many more contacts.

Over the years I have notice, the CW operators are going 90 miles an hour and I am receiving at 30 to 35 MPH! Yea, I know it is supposed to be Words Per Minute however, MPH is a better illustration. Big Grin. (My current reception speed is approximately 15 to 17 WPM).

MIXING IT UP WITH THE CUB SCOUTS!






