

Signal Triangulation

Signal triangulation is one method to locate an interfering noise or signal to itssource, so the noise or interference can be corrected. HAMs call the activity "Fox and hounds" or "Fox and geese" or "Hide and seek;" or just "Fox Hunt" afew names for the same activity.

The purpose of this fun activity is for trainingand teaching the principles of signal triangulation.

Back in the 60's and 70's, several of us were "CB folks" and played with our mobile radios at night (had to work for a living during the day). Anywho-o-o ... One activity I recall having fun with was our version of "Hide N Go Seek" where one vehicle would go hide and 10 (15) minutes later the rest of us would drive the streets and back alleys looking for the vehicle known as the Fox. The Fox was to transmit every 5 minutes for 5 seconds. Please take note; for me that was well over 5 decades ago (closer to 60 years now) and I do not recall the exact timing, however it was fun, while at the same time teaching us signal locating.

One specific evening a guy and his girlfriend took off and 10 minutes later weheaded out to burn some of that 19 cent gasoline. Each headed in differentdirections and took note of the received S-units on our radios, when the "Fox" transmitted. Each of us had driven to a different location and we disclosed our receive S-unit readings to each other while waiting for another transmit. By comparing our signal strength, we were able to move to a different spot. We worked as a team to locate to Fox. I should say, the Fox was not allowed to move (hints I am thinking he had a 15 minute head start instead of 10). I cannot recall anyone ever breaking the "do not move rule." This night was starting to be "extra" difficult and challenging for the searchers. My 102" whip antenna was mounted at the left rear corner of my car. This helped to provide direction to received signals. Finally we ALL arrived on Main Street ... pulled to the side of the road and looked over the parked cars. We could see the white fiberglass 102" antenna in the middle of the drive-in theater. !!! Thinking back now, I remember his 102" whip at the rear of his vehicle as well. That means his transmissions would have beenprimarily headed west. HI HI. Not sure the direction factor is effected withtransmit (?) but it is with receive.

It was a very interesting game to play for a weekend "Fox Hunt" exercise. Today, the drive-in theater has been replaced with an indoor theater. However, parking lots are all around town and with a 15 minute drive; a challenging position could be found to park until found by the group. I was thinking of Covered Bridge Park or Clover Dell but they would need a 20 minute lead depending on the start point in town.

This type activity is good training.
